Disaster Preparedness

• "This is the new wildfire risk and we can't defend you from this."

- Know your risks
- California:
 - Fire
 - Flood
 - Earthquake
- Plan and Drill contingencies faced in most recent disaster



Stages of Preparedness

- Individual: You and your animals
- Local Neighborhood
- City and County
- First Responder
- State/National: Pets
 Evacuation and Transportation
 Standards (PETS) Act





Individual Preparedness for Large Animals

- Backpack with:
 - Recent photos: side views and front
 - Coggins test
 - Vaccine history
 - Microchip
 - Contact information
 - Luggage tags/Mane
 - Zip ties, plastic bags

- ER Kit in Duffle bag
- Tarps, temp fencing
- Knife, scissors
- Wire, bolt cutters
- Bandage supplies
- Headlamps/lights
- Batteries
- Duct tape
- Meds-feed in cooler



Animal ID Options

- Microchip
- Collar/tags
- Mane clip
- Luggage tags (crates)
- Wax crayon
- Sharpie on hoof or horn
- Ag spray paint marker
- Initials 1-#





Individual Preparedness for Small Animals


- Crates clean, ready
- Know evacuation plan/sites
- Collapsible water bowls
- Large water bottle
- Food, baggies
- Hand wipes/Baby wipes
- Leash, Collar, Microchip
- Recent photos of pet
- Vaccine records
- Medications
- Practice once monthly

- Shelter in place
- Prioritize human life
- Leave food and water, toilet seat up
- Pictures/feed plans on wall
- Perimeter fencing
- Do not lock in kennel, barn
- Evac plan- stock trailer, ice block



Fire Preparedness Around Barn

- Have a plan, post and practice it
- Red Flag/Flood warnings...stage
- Barn door/ perimeter fence
- Defensible space- bulldoze
- Emergency kit/numbers
- Pictures/feed instructions postedvices
- Water/sprinklers/fire extinguisher
- Head light, leather gloves
- Halters/leads for each horse
- Mane clips- ID pre filled
- Remote hay storage





Self Preparedness & Prevention

- Evacuation plan A&B
- Shelter in place plan- 7 days
- Drill with neighbor/friend
- Who will load, evac when you can't get there?
- Will your animals cooperate?
- Is there someone in this room you can plan with?
- Road access





Home Preparation

- Insurance update
- Narrated video tour of property, home
- Vital documents archived
- Generator/backup battery
- Chain saw
- Sprinklers on roof
- Annual gutter, brush, combustible check-May
- Proximity to creek beds
- Communication plan- landline, radio, solar charger





Train Your Animals to Load Up

- Hauling arrangements- trailershare with someone across town?
- Trailer maintenance
- Practice once monthly- all animals: different conditions
- Leather halter
- Leg wraps, bell boots
- Practice every time you hear of local fire. Stage Red Flag!!!!





Trailer Inspection List

- Tires
- Floorboards
- Latches, Hitch
- Interior/exterior lighting
- Escape hatches
- Tie rings
- Fuel in truck, jump cables
- Chain saw
- ER blanket/Flares
- Fire extinguisher
- First aid kit
- Hose/buckets/feed





San Diego Wildfires - loading
5 min rule - Evacuation teams
Halters, leads, tags, tied up and ready







Chickens

- Shelter in place
- Release from coop if unable to evacuate
- Leave large amount food and water
- Do not load if sick/quarantined
- Can be trained to load -practice
- Crates in horse trailer. Luggage tags
- Expect some loss- wildlife





Exotics

- Most can be trained to cratepractice!
- Snakes/lizards/Koi- leave notes on cages
- Label food/instructions
- Prepare caretakers
- Dispatch- size, temperament, location of transport mechanism
- Pillow cases ©





Evacuation Sites

- Central info/messaging
- Shelter in place-stage
- Meds, feed supps in cooler
- Take pictures-recent
- Leave early
- Plan two routes
- Ice in trailer on hot day
- Collapsible water buckets
- Hay and water for 72 hr
- Have a back up plan

Get to Know Your Neighbors

- Make arrangements to check on each other
- Share evacuation plans-site inspection
- Pool resources such as generators, water tanks, trailers
- Create evacuation authority agreements
- Share ER kit/ medical records locations
- Designate a safe meeting zone
- Maintain animal location map/priority
- Practice/ Drill/ Red Flag Stage



Recommended Training

- FEMA Website- training ICS 100,200,700
- Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)
- First Aid animals
- Hauling safety/inspection
- Fire line safety
- Ham radio training
- Downed power pole

- Well checks/ field shelter
- Communications
- Evacuation
- Outreach
- Volunteer management
- Donation management

Trailer and Equipment Acquired

- 3 horse slant trailer with ramp
- SA staging trailer
- Evacuation trailers
- Glides/LAL/Mannequin
- Evac kits
- First Aid materials
- Shelter set up materials including 500 panels
- Hand held radios

Preliminary Animal Response Statistics Napa CNLU Fire Response

Evacuations

- 740 Horses to NVHA, VBEC, Vintage Farm and Solano Fairgrounds
 - 18% required some form of medical care
- 250 Ruminants to Vintage Farm, Solano Fairgrounds and Ag for Youth.
- 27 cats, 2 dogs, 35 birds, 21 chickens evacuated by Napa CART

Estimated Napa County Large Animal Losses

- 8 horses
- 500 ruminants


Volunteer hours

- Community volunteers: 1216 hours based solely on sign-in sheets
- Large Animal DVMs: 1328 hours- Nor Cal AEP



Lessons Learned

- Work with OES to utilize existing services: food, volunteer, donation management, at each shelter site.
- Animal shelter support entities meet quarterly
- Develop "211" information line for pet owners which leads to animal specific dispatch requests.
- Develop Nixle alert for certified haulers with staging information
- Alert system on red flag days- stage as county and as response entity.
- Identify LA shelter locations throughout county- fire/flood
- Stockpile supplies throughout county
